

## NEW BICYCLE PUMP TRACK COMING TO MURDOCH PARK

Exciting news for outdoor enthusiasts and families in Crossfield, the construction of a brand-new bicycle pump track at Murdoch Park is set to begin very soon! Work is scheduled to get underway within the first two weeks of May. Weather permitting, construction is expected to take approximately five to six weeks to complete.

The paved pump track is being thoughtfully designed by Bike Track Ltd. to accommodate a wide range of users and skill levels. It will feature both a beginner loop and an intermediate section for more advanced riders. The design incorporates a variety of elements, including jumps, whoops, banked corners, and transfer sections, which is sure to create a dynamic and engaging riding experience.

This project is made possible through funding from the Town of Crossfield, the Crossfield & District Recreation Board and Rocky View County. The Town extends its sincere thanks to both the Crossfield & District Recreation Board and Rocky View County for their support in bringing this project to life.

To accommodate construction, one small piece of playground equipment (the car) will be removed. Safety remains a top priority and secure fencing will be installed around the work area throughout the project. While the contractor will aim to maintain access to the remaining playground equipment, there may be times when temporary restrictions are necessary to allow for the safe movement of materials.

Some tree removal may also be required; however, these trees are currently in poor health and will be replaced with new, healthy plantings as part of the project.

Each year in May, the Town of Crossfield sends a combined Taxation Notice & Property Assessment.

**While assessment and taxation are related, they are not the same.**

**Assessment** is an estimate of your property's value for tax purposes.


**Taxation** is when the tax rate is applied to that value to calculate your property taxes.

## HOW IS THE ASSESSMENT DETERMINED?

The Town of Crossfield assesses property based on provincial legislation and regulations. The standard process in Alberta is determined by the "market value assessment". The assessment is done by a provincially accredited independent assessor. The Town's Administration and Council do not have the legal authority to change this assessment.

Market value assessments are done using mass appraisal models (the expression of supply and demand factors and the interaction in the real estate market), which determine property values by grouping similar properties as of a specific date. The 2026 assessment is an estimate of a property's market value as of **July 1, 2025**, and reflects the characteristics and physical condition of the improvements on **December 31, 2025**.

**Did You Know?**



In Alberta, assessment and taxation legislation helps ensure assessments are fair and equitable. Each property is assigned a value (your assessment) which is used to help distribute property taxes across the community. Your property assessment is an estimate of market value as of July 1, 2025.

Factors such as, but not limited to, recent sales of comparable properties in the area, property size, age, location renovations or improvements made to the property all contribute to your property's assessed value.

## WHAT IF I DON'T AGREE WITH MY ASSESSMENT?

You have the right to request more information regarding your assessment. Please contact our office at 403-946-5565 or email [receivables@crossfieldalberta.com](mailto:receivables@crossfieldalberta.com). An assessor can review your assessment and provide an explanation specific to your property.

If you have spoken with an assessor and still feel that your property assessment is incorrect, you may file a complaint with the Municipality. Complaints can only be filed against the assessed value of the property, not against the taxes or tax rates.

**The deadline to file a complaint is Monday, July 13, 2026.**

# 2026 Property Tax and Assessment Information

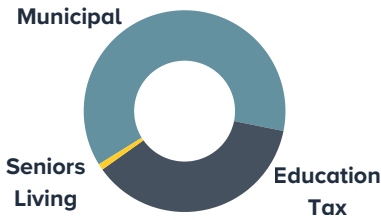
## HOW IS THE TAX RATE SET?

Municipal tax rates are set each year by Council as part of the annual budget process. First, the Town determines how much revenue is needed to provide services such as roads, fire protection, parks, and recreation, after accounting for other sources of revenue like grants and user fees.

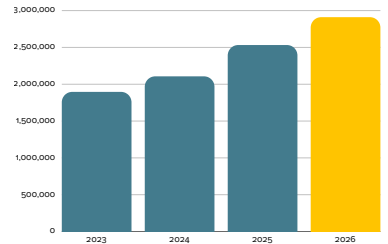
The remaining amount must be collected through property taxes.

The tax rate is then calculated by dividing the total amount of tax revenue required by the total assessed value of all properties. Once Council approves the budget and tax rates, they are applied to each property's assessed value to determine how much property tax each owner will pay.

In simple terms, the tax rate is set to ensure the Town collects the funding needed to provide services for the community.

## WHERE DO MY TAX DOLLARS GO?

### MUNICIPAL PORTION OF PROPERTY TAXES

The municipal portion of your property taxes funds all the services we offer, such as roads, recreation and parks, protective services and much more!

### NON-MUNICIPAL PORTION OF PROPERTY TAXES

Your tax bill also includes levies the Town collects on behalf of others for education and senior living. The Town does not set the amount of these levies.

#### Rocky View Foundation:

This levy helps to provide affordable housing options to independent seniors living in the Rocky View County region.

#### Provincial Education Tax:

All Alberta municipalities collect an equitable share of the Education Tax in proportion to their total taxable property assessments. In Crossfield this amount has grown by 15% for 2026.

## METHODS OF PAYMENTS

### TAX PAYMENTS ARE DUE BY 4:30 P.M. TUESDAY, JUNE 30, 2026

The following methods of payment are accepted:

**In Person:** Town office, located at 1005 Ross Street Mon. - Fri.,: 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Payments may also be left in the secure drop box, located to the left of the main entrance. Please note: Credit cards are no longer accepted.

**At your financial institution:** Make payments in person or through telephone/online banking. Please use your tax roll number and allow three (3) to five (5) business days for payment to be received.

**Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP):** This plan provides participants with the opportunity to make monthly installment payments. More information is available at [crossfieldalberta.com](https://crossfieldalberta.com) or by scanning the QR code.

**By mail:** Make cheques or money orders payable to the "Town of Crossfield" and mail to Box 500 Crossfield, AB T0M 0S0

**FAILURE TO RECEIVE YOUR TAX NOTICE DOES NOT EXEMPT YOU FROM LATE PAYMENT PENALTIES. A 12% PENALTY WILL BE APPLIED TO OUTSTANDING BALANCES AS OF JULY 1, 2026.**

## What's Changing with Property Tax Payments

**Effective January 1, 2026**

**Credit Cards no longer accepted for property tax payments**

This change helps reduce the high processing fees associated with credit card transactions and is expected to save taxpayers approximately \$17,000 in 2026 alone.

**Residents are encouraged to sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP).**

TIPP allows property owners to spread their annual property tax bill into smaller, manageable monthly payments, making budgeting easier throughout the year.

## TIPP Tax Installment Payment Plan

**The convenient way to pay your property taxes!**

**The program runs January to December, but property owners may sign up at any time  
Sign up information is below.**

The Tax Installment Payment Plan divides your annual property taxes into monthly sums that are automatically withdrawn from your bank account. There are no fees or interest charged when enrolling in the TIPP program.

How TIPP Works:

- Payments will be withdrawn from your bank account on the first day of the month. If the first day of the month is not a regular business day, the payment will be withdrawn on the following business day.
- The plan runs from January to December.
- Payments are recalculated in January and July of each year.
- The first six (6) payments are based on the previous year's taxes levied. The payment amount for the last six (6) months of the year will change due to an increase or decrease to the annual levy.
- Participants will be notified of the new installment amount in the annual taxation notice which is sent in May every year.
- The Town does not charge for this service, however, normal bank service fees may apply.



# Crossfield Approves 2026 Municipal Budget Focused on Sustainability and Growth

The Town of Crossfield has officially approved its 2026 Municipal Budget, setting a clear course for the year ahead with a strong emphasis on community priorities, infrastructure investment, and long-term financial stability.

Developed with resident feedback in mind, the 2026 Budget reflects a commitment to maintaining essential services while planning responsibly for future growth. Town officials describe the budget as balanced, transparent, and firmly focused on sustainability.

To address rising costs and service demands, the budget includes a 6.69% municipal property tax adjustment. This increase is carefully structured to support key areas, including:

- 0.55% for inflationary pressures
- 1.43% for asset management
- 1.97% for service level adjustments
- 2.74% to support RCMP policing services

The service level adjustments will allow for increased snow clearing, maintenance of additional parks and open spaces, and the addition of a Bylaw Enforcement Officer.

For homeowners, the impact remains modest. A home assessed at the average value of \$492,300 will see an increase of approximately \$140 per year or \$11.65 per month in municipal taxes. This investment helps provide reliable services, community safety, and financial sustainability for the town.

The 2026 Budget also strengthens reserve funding and improves long-term financial planning, reinforcing Crossfield's commitment to sustainable growth and a community that residents are proud to call home.



## Hold on to your lids!



Here are some tips to help on windy Waste/Recycling Collection Days

- **Keep the lid closed** – An open lid can catch the wind and cause your cart to tip over. It also increases the chance of loose materials blowing out.
- **Avoid overfilling your cart** – A raised or propped lid is more likely to catch the wind and tip.
- **Consider waiting until the next collection day** – Holding onto your recycling during high winds can help prevent carts from blowing over or away. If needed, extra recycling can be taken to the Transfer Station (33 Laut Crescent) at no cost.
- **Set carts out in the morning** – Place your cart out before 7 a.m. on collection day rather than the night before to reduce the risk of overnight wind tipping.
- **Bring carts back promptly** – Returning your carts to your property as soon as possible after collection helps prevent them from blowing over.
- **Label your carts** – Write your address on your waste and recycling carts using a permanent marker. This makes it easier to identify your carts if they get mixed up with your neighbours' on windy days.

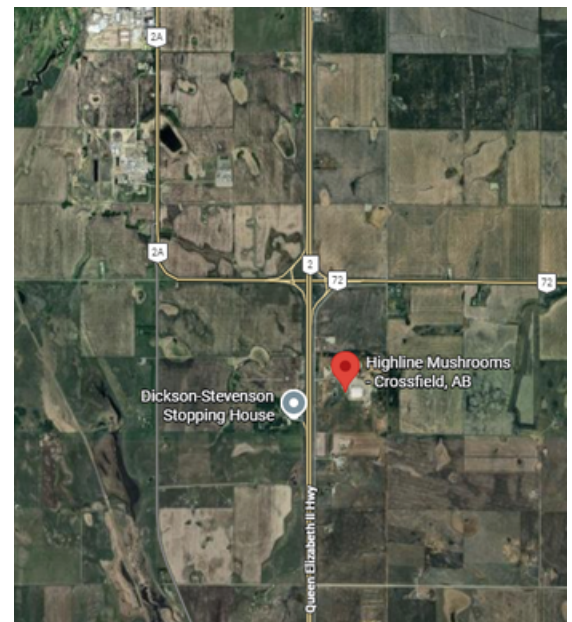


## Highline Mushrooms West - Crossfield Farm Gardener Appreciation Day - May 9, 2026

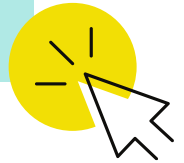
