
Bike Skills & Pump Track Continues to Make Progress

HOW ARE PROPERTY TAXES CALCULATED?

The amount of property tax you pay is based on the assessed value of your property. Assessment values for 2026 are based on the provincially legislated valuation date of July 1, 2025, and the physical condition of a property as of December 31, 2025. The assessed value of your home can vary widely from today's market value.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT COMPLAINTS

As a taxpayer you have comprehensive rights to information and due process. An assessed person is entitled to see or receive sufficient information about their property in accordance with the Municipal Government Act section 299, or a summary of an assessment in accordance with Section 300, or both.

If you are the assessed person and would like more information regarding your assessment, please contact our office at 403-946-5565 or email receivables@crossfieldalberta.com.

An assessor can review your assessment and provide an explanation specific to your property. If you have spoken with an assessor and still feel that your property assessment is incorrect, you may file a complaint with the Municipality.

Complaints can only be filed against the assessed value of the property, not against the taxes or tax rates.

The deadline to file a complaint is Monday, July 13, 2026.

METHODS OF PAYMENTS

TAX PAYMENTS ARE DUE BY 4:30 P.M. TUESDAY, JUNE 30, 2026

The following methods of payment are accepted:

In Person: Town office, located at 1005 Ross Street Mon. - Fri.,: 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Payments may also be left in the secure drop box, located to the left of the main entrance.

Please note: Credit cards are no longer accepted.

At your financial institution: Make payments in person or through telephone/online banking. Please use your tax roll number and allow three (3) to five (5) business days for payment to be received.

Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP): This plan provides participants with the opportunity to make monthly installment payments. More information is available at crossfieldalberta.com or by scanning the QR code.

By mail: Make cheques or money orders payable to the "Town of Crossfield" and mail to Box 500 Crossfield, AB T0M 0S0

FAILURE TO RECEIVE YOUR TAX NOTICE DOES NOT EXEMPT YOU FROM LATE PAYMENT PENALTIES.

A 12% PENALTY WILL BE APPLIED TO OUTSTANDING BALANCES AS OF JULY 1, 2026.





What's Changing with Property Tax Payments

**Effective January 1, 2026
Credit Cards no longer accepted for
property tax payments**

This change helps reduce the high processing fees associated with credit card transactions and is expected to save taxpayers approximately \$17,000 in 2026 alone.

Residents are encouraged to sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP).

TIPP allows property owners to spread their annual property tax bill into smaller, manageable monthly payments, making budgeting easier throughout the year.

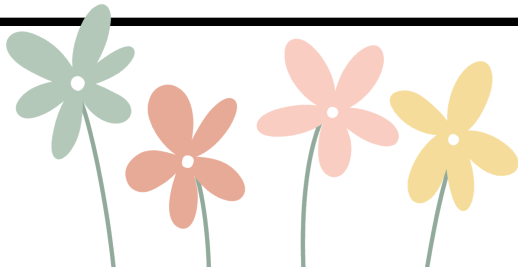

WIPP is the Town's Water Installment Payment Plan service. It allows Water and Sewer customers to pay their bills automatically through direct debit.

your property taxes!**

**The program runs January to December,
but property owners may sign up at any time
Sign up information is below.**

The Tax Installment Payment Plan divides your annual property taxes into monthly sums that are automatically withdrawn from your bank account. There are no fees or interest charged when enrolling in the TIPP program.

How TIPP Works:

- Payments will be withdrawn from your bank account on the first day of the month. If the first day of the month is not a regular business day, the payment will be withdrawn on the following business day.
- The plan runs from January to December.
- Payments are recalculated in January and July of each year.
- The first six (6) payments are based on the previous year's taxes levied. The payment amount for the last six (6) months of the year will change due to an increase or decrease to the annual levy.
- Participants will be notified of the new installment amount in the annual taxation notice which is sent in May every year.
- The Town does not charge for this service, however, normal bank service fees may apply.

Camping Season is Here: Know the Rules for Parking and Storing Your Holiday Trailer

With summer just around the corner, camping season is on the horizon! As residents prepare for weekend getaways and family adventures, Crossfield Municipal Enforcement would like to remind everyone of the Traffic Bylaw requirements regarding the parking and storage of holiday trailers. These regulations help ensure the safety of all road users and maintain clear access throughout our community.

A few things to keep in mind when bringing your camper into town:

- Trailers parked on a street must be attached to a vehicle at all times, or risk being towed.
- A trailer may be parked on a street for up to 72 consecutive hours (3 days). After 72 hours, it must be relocated for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to the same location.
- Vehicles or trailers parked for more than 72 hours may be deemed abandoned and are subject to enforcement action, including towing.
- Ensure your trailer is not draining or allowing leakage of oils or fluids onto the road.



- Trailers may not park within 5 meters of a marked crosswalk, stop sign, yield sign and fire hydrants. Or within 1.5 meters of an access to a garage, private road, driveway, or pathway.

Reminder: your trailer is considered a vehicle and is subject to the same parking regulations.

Crossfield Municipal Enforcement appreciates your cooperation in helping keep our roads safe, accessible and enjoyable for everyone this camping season.

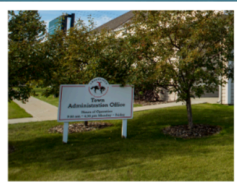

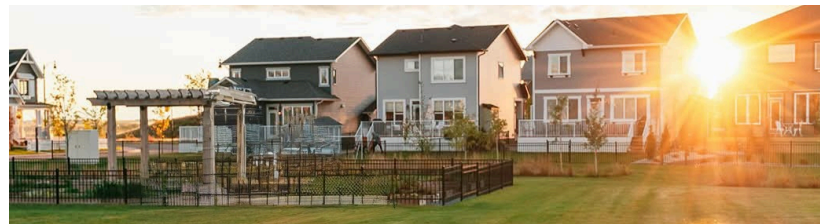

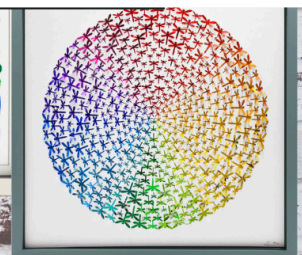
